Focal Point: Thanksgiving

Blessings. My muse this month brought me right to the topic of blessings which is



so appropriate for Thanksgiving during November. Here's my story and I'm sticking with it! Last week, I was driving in a westerly direction down Empire Blvd around 11am. About halfway down the Empire Road "dip", I was overtaken by the vista created by the sun illuminating the brilliant colors of the trees on the hillside bordering Irondequoit Bay. There had been rain earlier that day but the sun came out in its brilliance and everything

appeared bright, fresh and crisp.



Against the intensely dark, still-stormy looking sky, the colors seemed to leap out. I began to think about what a great job the dark sky did in allowing the trees to pop and glow intensely. The scene almost knocked my socks off. I realized that "Mother Nature" already has in her repertoire, the various "tricks" that we artists deliberately use to show off focal points in our art. These include using:

◆Scale – large or small next to your focal point

◆Isolation – space to separate a subject from other items in the painting

◆Placement – the rule of thirds for positioning the focal point or framing it with negative space or a type of contrasting coloration

◆Pointing or convergence – objects that lead the viewer's eye toward the focal point

◆Unusual subjects – something so different from the rest of the piece that it jumps out.



As an example, visualize a moose sitting in an armchair knitting

an afghan when the rest of the piece depicts classical, dignified interior design. (I hope this hasn't preempted the subject for your next piece!)



◆Color – light against dark, neutral against bright, cool against warm

◆Contrast – color, texture, various shapes and forms, among others
The Fall scene described above was an excellent example of contrast and color. I only wish I had the ability to compose a piece of such grandeur.

In life we go through these contrasts of ups and downs, weathering our own storms. But I believe that the tempests have a hidden function in that they can make the beauty of our blessings "pop" all the more. If our blessings become our focal point, they can help us "Ease on down, ease on down the road" (Song lyrics written by Charlie Smalls from "The Wiz").

Among the many blessings I treasure are the



friendships, intercooperation, support and instruction of our many club members. We have pulled off a very successful year of art presentations, demos, get-togethers, Spring and Holiday Shows, and other things. We owe a big round of thanks to our officers, show chairs, committees, volunteers, and all who have interacted to make this a truly stellar art club. Let thanksgiving be the focal point of our art! May you all have a wonderful Thanksgiving to "draw" upon as we slowly "converge" on another year.

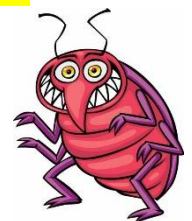
